INTRA-DISTRICT TRANSFERS

(Within the District) May 15 to Aug. 1

The Intra-District Transfer Application should be completed by the parents/guardians of any secondary student zoned to BISD, who wishes to attend a secondary campus outside their zoned area.

When applying for an Intra-District Transfer, parents/guardians shall go to the Pupil Services website and complete the submittal form. After receiving a bisd.us email response the parent/guardian will upload the following:

- 1. Proof in the parent's/guardian's name through a current utility bill, utility deposit, unexpired lease, or rent receipt with the owner's address and telephone;
- 2. Parent's/guardian's photo identification; and
- Student's school records (current report card only if the student is coming from a charter/private school or is new to BISD).



INTER-DISTRICT TRANSFERS

(Out of the District)


May 15 (for returning students)

The Inter-District Transfer Application should be completed by the parents/guardians for any student currently zoned outside BISD boundaries, but wishes to attend a BISD campus.

When applying for an Inter-District Transfer, parents/guardians shall go to the Pupil Services website and complete the submittal form. After receiving a bisd.us email response the parent/guardian will upload the following:

- 1. Proof in the parent's/guardian's name through a current utility bill, utility deposit, unexpired lease, or rent receipt with the owner's address and telephone;
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- Student's school records (current report card if from a charter/private school or new to BISD).

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To apply continued...

- 7. Complete the application process by submitting application form;
- 8. The parent/guardian will receive an email from Docusign from a bisd.us email within 2-4 business days after submitting the request via the website;
- 9. The parent/guardian will need to open and sign/upload requested documents from Docusign;
- 10. After the parent/guardian signs and uploads the documents: The transfer is sent for signatures from the required BISD Principals and Administrators.

Once all required signatures are obtained the parent/guardian will receive an email from Docusign with the title of COMPLETED in the subject line. This indicates that a decision has been reached and if approved the registration at the requested campus may begin. <u>IT IS THE PARENT'S/GUARDIAN'S RESPONISBILITY TO REGISTER THE STUDENT.</u>


If the Intra-District application is denied please contact the Area Assistant Superintendent of the requested campus for an appeal at 1900 E. Price Rd., or by calling 956-548-8000.



FAQ:

- 1. Intra-District transfers roll over automatically. The student only need to reapply if the student wants to change transfer schools at the end of the school year or they have been removed (withdrawn) from the requested school.
- 2. All Intra-District transfers begin on May 15 and end on Aug. 1 of the current school year for the incoming school year. (i.e. May 15, 2021 to Aug. 1, 2021 for the 2021-2022 School Year). *The only transfers accepted after the Aug. 1st deadline are for Charter/Private school students. If a student is coming in from out of state/city they still need to be coming in from a Charter/Private school to qualify after deadline.
- 3. All Inter-District Transfer Applications are year round as they have no deadline, however for returning students needing them for the incoming year parents can beginning applying May 15 (i.e. May 15, 2021 for the 2021-2022 school year). For new and/or PreK3/4 students parents can begin applying earlier and can call into Pupil Services for the date applications will be made available.
- 4. If a student will be living with a guardian they will need to complete the POA (Power of Attorney) documentation first as the guardian will need to complete the application. Have the guardian contact Pupil Services if they need assistance.
- 5. If the parent/guardian lives with someone and the bills are under the other person's name they will need a residence verification sent with the application. Have the parent call Pupil Services if they need assistance.


Required Summer Reading

Assignment: Read ONE of the books presented on the following slide. This should be a novel you have not read before.


As you read, complete ONE of the projects on the book choice list.


Submit your completed project to your English I teacher by <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>August 31</u>, <u>2021</u>. (This will be a major grade.)
















You have 3 options for your project

one-pager



A one-pager is a single-page response to your reading. It combines visual and textual elements to present an author's argument or purpose and your response to it.

Graphic story board

You will be creating a graphic story board that is a reflection of your choice of novels. You need to create a series of 12+ drawings in 12+ squares that show significant events in the novel.



College application



You will be creating a college application/resume and writing a college entrance essay from the point of view of the main character in your choice of novels. Use all the information you know about the character to create a college application packet for the character.

Option1-OnePager Project

A one-pager is a single-page response to your reading. It is a way of making a personal connection to a text and analyzing it imaginatively and honestly. A one-pager combines visual and textual elements to present an author's argument or purpose and your response to it.


What you will need to complete your one-pager:

- -1 sheet of cardstock paper (8 ½ by 11)
- -Markers, colored pencils, post-its, construction paper, magazine clippings, etc. (you are free to be creative with the materials you use)

This assignment can also be completed digitally. (google slides, PowerPoint, Pages, Keynote, etc.)

Design: What should your one-pager look like?


- -Your one-pager should be neat and creative
- -Include both visuals (drawings, sketches, pictures, etc.) and text (quotes from book, words, explanations)
- -Your first and last name written on the back of your project



Option1 ContinuecOnePager Project

Content: What information should be included in your one-pager?

- -The title of the novel and author's full name
- -Genre of the book selected (non-fiction, fiction, literary non-fiction, science fiction, etc.)
- -4 significant quotes taken directly from the text and page number
- -A response to 3 of the quotes you selected (why are those quotes important? What do they signify?)
- -A minimum of 4 visuals (includes photos and/or drawings (one-pagers are meant to be visually appealing and intrigue others)



Option 2 Graphic Storyboard

If you are not sure how to create a graphic storyboard, now would be a great time to learn; a website has also been included to give you some ideas as to how you can follow through on this choice of book project.

Supplies:

- Several sheets of sketch paper, drawing paper, or a poster board(s) - (read through the instructions to make your final decision)
- 2) Markers, ruler, etc.
- 3) Computer if you wish to complete this assignment digitally.



Project Objective:

You will be creating a graphic story board that is a reflection of your choice of novels. You need to create a series of 12+ drawings in 12+ squares that show significant events in the novel.

Make sure to include all 5 sequences of events in the plot pyramid, consider giving rising action and falling action more than one drawing/square, and add any drawings/squares for events in the novel that you feel are significant to the project. Under each picture/cartoon, write a few lines of explanation. A potential reader should be able to learn a lot about the event(s) and the character(s) from your graphic storyboard.

Option 3College Application & Essay

Project Objective:

You will be creating a college application/resume and writing a college entrance essay from the point of view of the main character in your choice of novels.

Use all the information you know about the character to create a college application packet for him/her; be creative in deciding what any missing information should be (e.g. address, school name, grades, extra-curricular activities, etc.) First, create a resume that includes the following (research resume templates)

Writing tools (you may create this electronically and submit a printed copy)

- ✓ High School Courses Taken
- **✓** Grades
- Extra-curricular Activities

Then, choose one of the following essay topics to write about in a two-page essay from the character's point of view:

- ✓ What experience, event, or person has had a significant impact on your life?
- ✓ Discuss a situation where you have made a difference.
- ✓ Describe your areas of interest, your personality, and how they relate to why you would like to attend this college.

(Remember to answer the essay question from the point of view of the main character from the novel)







STAMP & SPACE students must turn in the summer reading & writing assignments each school year.


